We have lived right next to Green Hills Mortuary for 30 years now. We come from a big family. When our uncle and aunt died, they were laid to rest at Green Hills. Our parents and the remainder of our large family have arranged our plots there also. We loved the assurance we had that our final wishes would be met, but most of all, we loved the beautiful pastoral setting and the ability to sit and reflect as one gazed out at the hills and the sea.

We contributed to the beautiful blue lighting of the Vincent Thomas Bridge, expecting our family to be able to enjoy the lights in the evenings as they visited our grave sites when the time comes.

Now we are learning that the Navy housing, which has always been designated for single-family dwellings, is being considered for high-rise development. We are horrified that Los Angeles would consider such a blight on the horizon and, as "property owners" at Green Hills and in Lomita, we strongly oppose this project. In speaking with our friends and neighbors, we find that a surprisingly large number of them have made similar plans, and share our concerns.

Please tell Los Angeles City Councilwoman Janice Hahn and those evaluating this project that there will be many souls turning in their graves if Ponte Vista is approved. We hope this imparts the same level of discomfort upon the decision-makers as they are causing all of us.
